

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday! I know what you are thinking – it's hard to believe. After all, we just put away our Christmas decorations, paid our Christmas gift expenses on credit card, and now Lent is upon us. It's one of those many reminders that life is going by quickly.

In fact, that is one of the purposes of Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent. It's message to us, symbolized so vividly by the imposition of ashes on our foreheads is echoed in what the priest or extraordinary minister of the Eucharist says to us: "Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return."

I'm always amazed how many people come out to get ashes. Sometimes I wonder if it's just a feel-good, easy thing to do. You know, not much required of you, just step up and get a cross on your head to show everybody you went to church. Believe me, I'm happy as a pastor to see so many people, no matter the motivation for coming. God is happy to see us come through the doors.

But Lent calls all of us to be conscious that life is temporary. Life in God's plan has a final destination. When I was a kid we had a catechism question and answer that summed up what I'm implying, with perfect words: "Why did God make us?" The answer: "God made us to know Him, to love Him and to serve Him in this world, so as to be happy with Him forever in heaven."

The holy season of Lent is a gift from God and his Church, to get our lives back on track, with its real purpose. Traditionally, the Church has urged four ways to observe Lent: **pray, fast, learn, give**.

We are united in prayer with their families and with one another as we and all the faithful departed await our rising with the Lord.

Scripture Readings

Matthew 4: 1-11

The readings start in a garden and end in a desert. In the garden with Adam and Eve, we encounter temptation, disobedience and ultimately shame. In the desert with Jesus we also encounter temptation, but instead of disobedience we see Jesus' radical obedience to the Father's will. Saint Paul tells us about the meaning of this contrast: the disobedience of one brought sin into the world, and the obedience of the other brought us salvation. Let us listen for how we fit into God's saving plan.

- Pray: Try to come to daily Mass. Say the rosary one day a week as a family, or access the app "Halo" and discover ways to pray and meditate, just for a few minutes.
- ◆ **Fast:** Try watching a little less news. Or less time surfing the internet.
- ◆ Learn: Try reading your bible, for just 15 minutes per day. Or go on YouTube to Fr. Mike Schmitz's 20-minute per day video or podcast, "The Bible in a Year." I visited a family the other day, who have been dedicating 20 minutes a day to this YouTube video and have learned so much about sacred scripture, and in such an easy way.
- Give: There are many ways to give to those in need. Giving is a real act of trust in God that when we give to others, God watches over us, that we have what we need.

When we see so many frightening things happening in our country and in our world, we often feel helpless. We say, "What can we do?" But we are not helpless. For Jesus, through His Church, has given us the holy season of Lent. Let the change begin with us. Don't curse the darkness – light a candle in your life and truly make a difference this Lent.

ARCHDIOCESE OF PHILADELPHIA BEGINS 48th ANNUAL RICE BOWL INITIATIVE

For the 48th consecutive year, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia has kicked off Catholic Relief Services' (CRS) Rice Bowl, the nationwide Lenten program that provides people of all ages with ways to put their faith into action through prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

This year, Rice Bowl will officially begin on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22 and conclude on Holy Saturday, April 8. At St. Bede Parish, Rice Bowl envelopes were included in everyone's March collection envelope packet. They can be used to contribute at any Mass during the month of Lent. Thank you!

Fast and Abstinence, and Other Acts of Penance for Lent

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are 14 years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22, 2023 on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all



persons 18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world.





Journey to the Permanent Diaconate: Another Milestone

The journey to the Permanent Diaconate has three important steps or milestones. They are Candidacy, Lector, and Acolyte.

Back in 2018, I began my discernment and formation at St. Charles Seminary. Then, in September 2020, I humbly received the Rite of Candidacy, the formal call by the Church, and my commitment to study for Holy Orders as a Permanent Deacon.

In October 2021, I was called by Archbishop Perez to be instituted to the ministry of Lector, which allows a candidate to proclaim the readings from Scripture, except for the Gospel, along with teaching & instructing the faithful outside Mass, among other responsibilities.

With great joy, the third step was completed Saturday, February 11, as 13 seminarians in priestly formation, seven other deacon candidates, and I were called by Archbishop Perez and instituted to the acolyte ministry by Bishop James D. Conley. As part of the rite, the bishop handed each of us a Sacred Vessel with the following instruction: "Take this vessel with bread for the celebration of the Eucharist. Make your life worthy of your service at the table of the Lord and of his Church."

An acolyte's function is to assist the priest or deacon at the altar. His primary duty is ordered towards the Eucharist and the care of the Sacred Vessels. It is his place principally to prepare the altar and Sacred Vessels and assist priests and deacons in distributing Holy Communion to the faithful. Furthermore, if a deacon is not present, the acolyte may assist the priest by performing other functions such as incensation, purifying, arranging the Sacred Vessels after Communion, etc. The acolyte is also, in the absence of a priest or deacon, entrusted with other duties,

such as the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the distribution of Holy Communion to the sick.

I am grateful to be called to this ministry, and I take seriously the words which the bishop spoke at the Mass of Institution:

"As a person chosen for the ministry of acolyte, you will have a special role in the Church's ministry. The summit and source of the Church's life is the Eucharist, which builds up the Christian community and makes it grow. You are responsible for assisting priests and deacons in their ministry. You should strive to live more fully by the Lord's sacrifice and to be molded more perfectly in its likeness and offer yourself daily to God as a spiritual sacrifice acceptable to him through Jesus Christ."

My formation and studies will continue for another few years when, God willing, I am ordained to the Diaconate.

I thank my wife Rachel, Monsignor Marine, Fr. Ryan, and all of you for your prayerful support, and ask you to continue to pray for the other men at St. Charles Seminary and me as we pursue this yocation of service.

Hello Everyone

I had a thought this week and I thought I would share it with you.... We say the St. Michael prayer every week before we leave church but do we, particularly our youth, really pay attention to what we are saying?

"St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the Devil...... Cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen"

First, I wonder if young people believe we are in a "battle"? It's a battle for their souls (all of our souls). There are so many ways that the devil is attacking us and if we are not aware of what we let into our minds and hearts, we may be participating and allowing the devil to slowly win the battle.

Secondly, I wonder if our young people believe there is a devil? They love horror movies and the idea of evil that lurks around the corner but do they *REALLY* believe the devil is alive and active in our world? There are some studies that show they actually do believe (Satanism has increased steadily over the last 5 years). The appeal seems to be leaning toward their youth who don't want the structured, dogmatic religion. I wonder if we make Satan more appealing by not discussing the "enemy" or "devil" with young people today. Are we making him seem unreal and abstract?

Lastly, we say that this devil and evil spirits "prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls." Again, do we/our youth believe this? I trust we have a sense of the evil that exists, especially when we hear horror stories of inhumane treatment of others in our world. We express it when we hear of cruelty toward animals, killing of babies, trafficking of women or other inhumane treatment of people in the world..... But do we see that as happening "over there" and not something that our families, our children are affected by? If we are honest, we know that "evil" exists and if we are to protect our families we realize that we MUST be Sacramental people of prayer, peace and love. This is how we can't "battle" the evil in the world. Here is a portion of a quote from Pope Francis: "Every threat to the family is a threat to society itself. The future of humanity, as St. John Paul II often said, passes through the family.... (many families) be sanctuaries of respect for life, proclaiming the sacredness of every human life from conception to natural death.'

I spoke to the Confirmation students a week ago about the "battle" for their souls. I expressed that from my years of working with young people it seems to me that after Confirmation and especially the High School years are when young people need Jesus more than ever. 
