A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR My dear parishioners,

his coming Tuesday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. And on that feast day, the second reading will be from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, Chapter 15, Verses 20-27. In that reading Paul says,

"The last enemy to be destroyed is death."

There's so much to celebrate on this Holy Day, fast approaching. We celebrate the fact that Mary's life, which had been filled with so many challenges and so much suffering, ended so gloriously. We rejoice in her coronation as Queen of Heaven. And we cherish her role as a mother who promises to pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

But St. Paul's words in that second reading point to another very important truth that flows from Mary's Assumption: death has been defeated. Of course, Jesus' resurrection tells us the same thing. But with Mary's Assumption, the truth is driven home even more powerfully.

Naturally the news about the Eternal Son of God rising from the dead is marvelous. But a human being like Mary? That only proves that Jesus' resurrection has altered the shape of our lives, as well as His. For all who believe in the Lord, life is no longer limited to the few decades that we have on this earth. It now stretches out infinitely to an unlimited, glorious horizon where all pain, suffering and sin will be no more.

Yes, death has been defeated. It's over. Done. Destroyed. We still experience the end of our earthly existence, but it's not like the snuffing out of a candle. It's more like falling asleep, and waking up in the loving





Story of Our Lady of Knock: This will be a two part story, this week and next. The story of Our Lady of Knock is one not only for the Irish but the whole world. It was 1879 and the people of Central/West Ireland (County Mayo) were going through another famine, but not as horrible as the first one in the 1840s, as they Irish called it the Great Hunger. In the little village of Knock, Our Lady, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist and Jesus as the Lamb of God on an altar came to all that came to see the marvelous visions as the witness themselves described what happened on the Vigil of the Queenship of Mary on August 21st, 1879. They came in silence in the pouring rain to 22 villagers of all ages but in the end only 15 came forward as official witnesses. See next week's bulletin for more information. RCIA STORIES OF FAITH

R.C.I.A Stories of Faith is an outreach of St. Bede the Venerable to open the doors to the Catholic Church by explaining the R.C.I.A process to our community and spreading the stories of our parish members who have participated in the program here or as part of their own personal faith journey into full communion with the Catholic Church. What is R.C.I.A.? R.C.I.A. stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA is the process established by the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation-Baptism. Confirmation and the Eucharist. This initiation process involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." St. Bede's R.C.I.A. program runs from September 14 to May 4 on Thursday nights at 7:00 pm in the Drexel Center. <u>Who is R.C.I.A. for?</u>

1. Persons interesting in exploring and interested in the Catholic faith; 2. Persons in need of Baptism; 3) Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic; and 4) Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

What would you tell someone who might be inquiring about the Catholic faith or the RCIA Process?

Don't hesitate! It's the most important decision you will ever make.

How has the RCIA program helped you understand your faith and grow closer to

God?

It's helped me understand the way God worked in my life as a person, father, husband and leader. The revelation I got helped me see more clearly in my own spirituality. The awesome history and tradition of the Catholic faith taught me the magnitude of God's church and how awesome He is.

How do you plan to live out your faith going forward?

I plan to pray, live out the sacraments and scripture. With Gods help and direction I will continue to try to be the best husband and father I can be.

What is your favorite story in the Bible or about the Catholic faith?

Too many to list, but one that resonates with me is the story of Jacob as he wrestled with God. Ultimately God had to break him into submission. I see myself in this story, and I now see that God loves me and he wants me even if I choose to wrestle (which I have)!

If you were to write a story about your faith journey what would be the title of your story? The struggle is real and so is the faith.

Cornerstone for Life

WASHINGTON – On June 24, 2022, the Supreme Court of the United States issued its ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, which overturned the Roe v. Wade decision that legalized abortion in all 50 states. In advance of the anniversary of the Court's landmark decision, Bishop Michael F. Burbidge of Arlington, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a statement celebrating Dobbs and explaining how the Court's decision marked the beginning of a critical new phase in protecting human life.

"June 24, 2023, marks the one-year anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, and we have much to celebrate," Bishop Burbidge said. "By the grace of God, the nearly fifty-year reign of national abortion on demand has been put to an end. Roe v. Wade-a seemingly insurmountable blight on our nation-is no more!"

'Over the past year, while some states have acted to protect preborn children, others have tragically moved to enshrine abortion in lawenacting extreme abortion policies that leave children vulnerable to abortion, even until the moment of birth...The work that lies ahead continues to be not just changing laws but also helping to change hearts, with steadfast faith in the power of God to do so," he said.

"The task before us begins with the knowledge of the truth and our courage to speak it and to live it with compassion," he said, and stated that we are all called to "radical solidarity" with women facing an unexpected or challenging pregnancy and doing whatever we can to provide them with the care and support they need to welcome their children."


