A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

When I look at the calendar besides seeing the days of summer quickly passing away, I'm also aware that we are less than a month away from celebrating our **Annual Padre Pio Festival weekend, and Parish Picnic**. The Padre Pio Festival is Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 16 & 17.

This year's festival is very special for a couple of big reasons. First of all our celebrant and homilist for the 12:30pm Festival Mass on Sunday Sept. 17 will be **Archbishop Nelson Perez, the Archbishop of Philadelphia**. Other than the time a year ago when he came to celebrate the 10th anniversary of St. Katharine Drexel School with a Mass and a dedication of our new Learning Center, Archbishop Perez has never celebrated Sunday Mass here at St. Bede.

The other reason for his coming is to officially designate **St. Bede the Venerable Parish as the Archdiocesan Shrine of Padre Pio**. With the support of our Parish Pastoral Council, I applied for this status for our parish about a year ago. One of the stipulations to gain this title is that there needs to be evidence of ongoing devotion to the saint, for which this shrine is established.

Here at St. Bede, there is a strong devotion to Padre Pio among our parishioners. I hear and witness that all the time. Besides, we host an annual festival which attracts pilgrims from around the Archdiocese. And now we have established a **Padre Pio Monthly Prayer Group**, which fosters devotion throughout the course of the year.

Our designation as an Archdiocesan Shrine is similar to nearby Nativity Parish in Warminster, which is the Archdiocesan Shrine of St. Gianna Molla. Our status as a

shrine is not in any way to take away from the Padre Pio Shrine in Barto, PA, which is a National Shrine and offers an extremely wide range of exhibits and artifacts of this great saint's life. I encourage you, if you have not already, to make a visit to Barto. It's only about 45 minutes away.

I imagine that some Catholics in our Archdiocese may want to travel at some time during the year to our parish either as individuals or as a group, since we might be in closer proximity. If so, we will gladly accommodate their visit here for Mass and to pray before his statue, and venerate his relic.

As the Padre Pio Festival weekend approaches, I hope you will try to clear your calendars to come and participate and enjoy the many spiritual and social activities connected with the weekend. Also, your financial support of the Sponsor Program helps to defray the many expenses connected with the weekend. That support is needed and deeply appreciated.

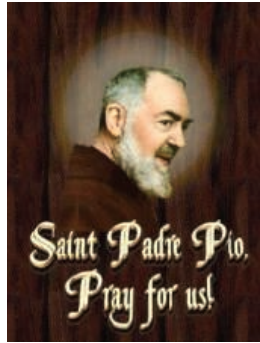

Dear Missionary Disciples,

Happy Sunday Missionary Disciples! This upcoming week we celebrate the Queenship of Blessed Virgin Mary on August 22. This is not a Holy Day of Obligation but is a very special day to celebrate our Lady's role as Queen of Heaven.

Pope Pius XII attributed Mary's Queenship to her motherhood, specifically of being the Mother of Jesus: "According to ancient tradition and the Sacred Liturgy the main principle on which the royal dignity of Mary rests is without doubt her divine motherhood." (Ad Caeli Reginam, 34).

Story of Our Lady of Knock (continued): In many ways, the apparition at Knock was very unique. Every person that came to the site saw the apparition, no words were spoken to all that came and the site were the figures were saw remained dry even though it poured down rain during most of the apparition. The day of the apparition, Knock did not speak any words to the Irish but profoundly communicated to them through silence and imagery. Silence is key to communion with God and others, so that we can hear God and others speak. The imagery of Knock speaks to the Eucharist and our heavenly destiny with Jesus the Lamb of God and all the saint and angles in heaven. Furthermore, Knock is both a picture of the Holy Family and the Church, with Jesus, Our Lady,

RCIA STORIES OF FAITH

R.C.I.A. Stories of Faith is an outreach of St. Bede the Venerable to open the doors to the Catholic Church by explaining the R.C.I.A. process to our community and spreading the stories of our parish members who have participated in the program here or as part of their own personal faith journey into full communion with the Catholic Church.

What is R.C.I.A.? R.C.I.A. stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA is the process established by the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. This initiation process involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." St. Bede's R.C.I.A. program runs from September 14 to May 4 on Thursday nights at 7:00 pm in the Drexel Center.

Who is R.C.I.A. for?

1. Persons interesting in exploring and interested in the Catholic faith; 2. Persons in need of Baptism; 3) Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic; and 4) Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

STORY OF FAITH- NANCY "ANN" STEZZI (ST. BEDE PARISHIONER)

Who or what led you to enter the RCIA process?

I had several things happen at once. First, I was regularly attending Mass at St. Bede with my family. Second, my son had a friend whose mom was in the choir. She found out from my son that I sang and she invited me to join the choir. I didn't need to be Catholic, so I joined. Being part of the Mass every Sunday and being part of the special liturgies and being embraced by such a loving, faith based

group of people led me to loving the faith, too. And third, I grew in admiring my mother-in-law's deep faith. She never pressured me to convert. She just lived her Catholic faith every day and was an inspiring example of how I wanted to live my life. It just seemed like a natural progression to find out more about the Catholic faith, so I entered the RCIA program.

Was there any point of the process that you found helpful?

It was all helpful. Getting all the basics of the Catholic faith, getting introduced to the history of the Catholic faith, having questions answered was all very important part of the process. But the meaning of the Sacraments and the Eucharist were probably the highlight.

What would you tell someone who might be inquiring about the Catholic faith or the RCIA Process?

Go for it!!! It just may change your life!

How has the RCIA program helped you understand your faith and grow closer to God?

It made me realize that "becoming Catholic" is a life-long process. It doesn't end at the

Easter Vigil-it's just the beginning. But it is something that has to be part of my life every day.

How do you plan to live out your faith going forward?

I am still active with the choir. And I am honored to be part of the Sunday Mass as a cantor. I was drawn to the Catholic faith through music so I feel I am continuing to live my faith through music. But another extremely important factor in growing my faith life has been being part of two Bible study groups. The first is the Tuesday Morning Bible Study. I started with Jeff Cavin's Bible Timeline. It changed my life. The Bible came alive for me. I encourage you to join the Tuesday morning Bible study this fall because this course is being offered again. The second is the Wednesday morning Faith Enrichment group which is a prayerful discussion group of the next Sunday's Mass readings. All are welcome.

What is your favorite story in the Bible or about the Catholic faith?

I never get tired of the Prodigal son. Every time I hear it, I hear something new.

If you were to write a story about your faith journey what would be the title of your story?

"The Endless Journey-" The more I learn the more I want to know. And there is an endless amount to learn.

Cornerstone for Life

(LifeSiteNews) — The U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) announced Thursday that it has approved the first over-the-counter birth control pill, which starting next year will be available regardless of age.

The Associated Press reports that the FDA has approved Opill, manufactured by Irish company Perrigo, to be sold without a prescription. The pill, which is meant to be taken at the same time every day, uses progestin to block sperm from reaching the cervix, according to the manufacturer. Common side effects of the pill include bleeding, headaches, dizziness, nausea and cramps, according to the FDA, the AP reports.

Progestin-based contraceptives like Opill and Plan B are commonly promoted as alternatives to abortion because they supposedly prevent pregnancy rather than end it. In January, the FDA amended Plan B's label to clarify that it was not an abortifacient. But such drugs do in fact have abortifacient potential, and whether they prevent conception or implantation depends on when they are taken relative to a woman's cycle.

If Plan B is taken five to two days before egg release is due to happen, the interference with the LH signal prevents a woman from releasing an egg, no fertilization happens, and no embryo is formed, Dr. Donna Harrison of the American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians and Gynecologists explains, citing numerous studies. However, if the pill is taken during the two-day window in which embryos can form but positive pregnancy tests don't occur, studies indicate it has a likely embryocidal effect in stopping pregnancy.

Even so, a 2011 survey found that most OB/GYNs continued to say life begins at fertilization, not implantation, and a 2019 survey found that 96% of biologists affirmed that a human life begins at fertilization.

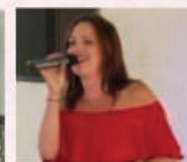
