A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR My dear parishioners,

 \mathbf{Y} ou probably have heard me talk or write pretty often already about the Eucharistic Revival taking place throughout

the Catholic world and these United States. Well guess what? I'm not finished! In fact as pastor, I feel the need to keep the Revival at the forefront not only in your mind, but

in mine as well.

Why do I say that? Well because like all things in life, when you do them over and over, they can become routine. For a priest who celebrates Mass at least once a day and sometimes two, if we are not careful it can Become commonplace. Celebrating the Holy Sacrament of the Mass is not, and should not be, just a part of my day, but the heart of my day.

That is one of the reasons I am devoted to Padre Pio. They say that when Padre Pio celebrated Mass, it was like he was celebrating his first Mass, his only Mass, or his last Mass. He saw the Mass and his reception of Holy Communion as the most important moment of his day.

That was Padre Pio's moment to meet God half-way on the bridge between heaven and earth. As a priest

he was privileged to call down God through the mysterious power bestowed on him at ordination. He realized he had become the bridge that united God with His people, and God's people with their God.

Remember that it is not always an easy thing to do. Like you, we priests have to not let distractions impede

Scripture Readings for Next Sunday

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time September 3, 2023

Jeremiah 20: 7-9 Psalm 63: 2-6, 8-9 Romans 12: 1-2 Matthew 16: 21-27



In our first reading, the price that Jeremiah pays to be a prophet is that he cannot be silent, even when speaking makes him an object of ridicule. In our Gospel, Jesus says that to follow Him means to deny oneself and take up one's cross. As we listen to these readings, we can ask ourselves, "What does it cost me to be a disciple?"

this precious moment of Communion, being united with God in the most perfect way this side of heaven.

But see, that's what the Eucharistic Revival is all about: utilizing ways to "revive" that awesome realization we had when we celebrated our First Holy Communion. Namely that when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion, we are receiving not a thing, but a Person. The very Person who was born in a stable, on Christmas. The very Jesus who performed miracles. The very Son of God who died on the cross and rose from the dead for us.

The other day I spoke to one of our St. Katharine Drexel School teachers who shared with me something that she shared with her own children. She had attended a Day of Recollection last year and the speaker said this: "Imagine in those 15 minutes or so that it takes for us to digest the Eucharist, we have the Son of God in our very body. It's like we have His undivided attention. It's like no one else on earth exists. So use that time well. Talk to Him. Tell Him what you need. Realize you carry Him in your very heart."

The teacher said that when she told her kids that, they said, "We never thought of it that way!" Now they want to come. They look forward to coming to Mass each Sunday.

So try it out. Remember, no sporting event, no other person or thing is greater than that encounter with God offered to us each week at Sunday Mass. Don't miss out on it!

May God bless you.



In the National Directory for Catechesis, the U.S. Bishops remind us that all of God's children, including those with disabilities, share a universal desire to know and understand the mysteries of God and possess the ability to proclaim the Gospel. St. Bede's Parish Religious Education Program (CCD) provides classes for children of all abilities. Children with developmental, intellectual, sensory, physical or behavioral disabilities are welcome and encouraged to attend weekly classes. FULL INTE-GRATION- The student participates in the religious education classroom with peers. INTEGRATION WITH ACCOMODATIONS-The student participates in the religious education classroom with the

support of a catechist assistant or peer tutor. INTEGRATION WITH INDIVIDUALIZED INSTRUCTION- The student participates in the prayers, confession opportunities, special classroom activities, etc...and receives individual instruction. This year Colleen Oriente, Heather Thompson and Alissa Maher will serve as a Special Education Catechists. They will be available to help our classroom catechists with special needs consultation as well as children needing individualized instruction. RCIA STORIES OF FAITH

R. C.I.A Stories of Faith is an outreach of

St. Bede the Venerable to open the doors to the Catholic Church by explaining the R.C.I.A process to our community and spreading the stories of our parish members who have participated in the program here or as part of their own personal faith journey into full communion with the Catholic Church. What is R.C.I.A.? R.C.I.A. stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA is the process established by the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. This initiation process involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." St. Bede's R.C.I.A. program runs from September 14 to May 4 on Thursday nights at 7:00 pm in the Drexel Center.

Who is R.C.I.A. for?

1. Persons interesting in exploring and interested in the Catholic faith; 2. Persons in need of Baptism; 3) Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic; and 4) Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

STORY OF FAITH- LANDRA CUNNINGHAM (ST. BEDE PARISHIONER) Who are what led your to anton the DCIA

Who or what led you to enter the RCIA process?

I was baptized Catholic and I can remember going to Mass with my mother when I was very young. I still have the "Missal" we used at Mass. My father was Protestant. When it was time for me to start my religious education, the decision was made for me to attend Sunday School at the Presbyterian church that my father's family attended. I continued to attend Sunday School and in 8th grade I attended "preparation" classes to receive Communion and Confirmation at our Palm Sunday church service. (Now that I look

back, I think this was very similar to the RCIA program).

When I met my husband, who is Catholic, I was still a member of my church. He was a member of his church choir and invited me to come sing with them. After that, I started to attend Mass with him and I began to feel drawn to the celebration of the Mass. When my husband and I decided to marry, I made the choice to become a full member of the Catholic church and received Communion and Confirmation at an Easter Vigil Mass.

What would you tell someone who might be inquiring about the Catholic faith or the RCIA process?

The RCIA program we have today wasn't available at the time I became a full member of the Catholic church. I was fortunate to become a "team member" in our RCIA program as a member of the Religious Education staff and attended the weekly classes. The program covers the teachings and traditions of the Catholic faith. I am grateful to have learned so much about our faith by experiencing the weekly interaction of the team members, attendees, and priests as we discussed the Scriptures, sacraments, tradi-

tions, and Catechism of the Catholic Church that are the foundation of our Catholic beliefs. How has the RCIA program helped you understand your faith and grow closer to

I have a greater appreciation and love for the traditions of the Catholic church which I didn't have growing up, especially regarding Mary, Our Mother, and the sacraments given to us by Jesus Christ. I am blessed to have participated in the religious education I received when I was young and to have experienced the Holy Spirit's calling to return to the Catholic faith, become a catechist, and continue Christ's mission as a member of the Catholic Church.

How do you plan to live out your faith going forward?

I will strive to be faithful to God and follow his teachings and be better at listening to God and trusting in His plan for me. I will remember the "Golden Rule" and treat others with kindness and respect. I will continue my personal religious education by enrolling in all of the Adult Faith Formation programs that are offered.

What is your favorite story in the Bible or about the Catholic faith?

Noah's Ark has always been a favorite because of the reminder of how we need to follow God's "instructions" for living our lives as Noah did and the rainbow that was sent as a sign of God's love and mercy (I'm always looking for the rainbow at the end of a storm!) My favorite Bible verse is John 3:16 - Sometimes I feel that I'm never going to get to heaven and have that eternal life, but I keep asking God daily to help me live as He wants me to here on earth so that someday I will see Him in heaven!

If you were to write a story about your faith journey, what would be the title of your story?

Daybreak"- to remember Christ's mercy and love for us and that each day is a new beginning in my faith journey.




