A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

This past week I was made keenly aware of the need to offer support to parents who have experienced a miscarriage. A young couple in our parish approached me recently and asked if I would be willing to celebrate a funeral Mass for their child, which miscarried. To be honest, it is not a request that I get very often in my close to 47 years of priesthood.

However, I imagine that the time of a miscarriage for a young couple is a time for sadness, disappointment and possible discouragement. We all know the joyous anticipation that arises once we hear that a couple is pregnant. And when that anticipation is extinguished by the suddenness of miscarriage or stillborn, a family and especially the couple are plunged into grief.

The couple I spoke about, Brittney and John, who approached me with the request, had some very important reasons for wanting a funeral service. They said, "We wondered if there was something else we could do for our child before bidding farewell." So they thought of a Mass. Besides, they said, "If this is a human life, why not, not only bring closure, but joy in knowing that we placed our child in the hands of Jesus."

The Catholic Church has a special Mass for a child who dies before baptism. Of course, relying on the fact that had the child lived, the intention of the parents would have had that child baptized, we say that the little child received a baptism by desire. Nonetheless, like all of the deceased, we pray for that child.

Here is the opening prayer of that special Mass: *"Lord God, ever caring and gentle, we commit to your love this little one, quickened into life for so short of a time. Enfold him/her in eternal life. We pray for his/her parents, who are saddened by the loss of their child. Give them courage and help them in their pain and grief. May they all meet one day in the joy and peace of your kingdom. We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen."*

In the case of the couple I mentioned, they kept it simple. Only they, the parents, were present for the Mass. By the way if you have experienced a miscarriage or stillborn, another option besides a Mass is a brief, simple service. As Catholic Christians, we respect human life in all its stages. We pray for all parents who have lost a baby. We as a parish stand ready to offer comfort in whatever way we can. The couple for whom I offered the Mass are willing to be of assistance to any couple who experienced a loss like they have. Please call me for any guidance you need.

National Right to Life on Election Results

On Tuesday Nov. 7, voters in Ohio voted for Issue 1, which will enshrine unlimited abortion in the state constitution.

Misinformation pushed a "women will die without Issue 1" message. This fearmongering led to voters deciding to allow abortion at any time for any reason in Ohio.

"Sadly the ones who will suffer for tonight's vote will be women and their unborn babies," said Carol Tobias, president of the National Right to Life.

"Lest We Forget"
