A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

The Gospel for yesterday's Mass for the Saturday of the First Week of Lent was particularly pertinent for Lent. Perhaps you are still deciding what to do for Lent. It's still early in the season to decide. However, maybe what God wants from you and I is not so much fasting as it is trying to forgive

an enemy. Or one who has hurt you. Or one you love.

Yesterday's Gospel included Jesus' famous words, "Love your neighbor. Love your enemies. Pray for those who persecute you." You know, when trying to get from one point to another, physically or spiritually, it's helpful to have a set of directions. In addition one must know priority of decision making: go here, then there, do this, then that.

In Saturday's Gospel, Jesus gave us a series of ascending steps to holiness. Each step is a little harder, a little more radical, and ultimately more fulfilling. "Love your neighbor." Then, "love your enemy." Finally, "pray for those who persecute you." Here, and in all the Gospel messages, love is not a feeling, or simply an emotion. It is an act of the will. It is to consistently will and choose the good of the other. This includes even those we do not like, or perhaps rightfully need to avoid because they are a threat. And the highest good is salvation and eternal life in Christ.

That human injustice and violence exists, and that emotions can color our viewpoint and understanding, makes the command to love an enemy seem impossible for us. It is! But it is not impossible for God, and with His help, we can do as God commands.

To love an enemy is not necessarily to like him nor is it to enable him or her, or condone their actions. It is simply to choose the good for him, and pray for his salvation. Praying for one we have hated or heavily disliked is an incredibly freeing experience. I know – I have done it. It

Scripture Readings for Next Sunday

Third Sunday of Lent March 3, 2024

The readings on this midpoint Sunday of Lent are indeed challenging. We have the Ten Commandments given to Moses and the Israelites, and we have Jesus confronting the status quo in the temple. Perhaps Saint Paul can give us the perspective we need: the Ten Commandments are the bedrock on which we stand, but we proclaim Christ crucified. As we hear these readings, let us ponder what it means to proclaim Christ crucified in own lives.



relieves us of the obligation to continue expending energy toward hate, rather than love. It provides intercession for that person, who may in fact have no one else to pray for him or her. What an incredible act of mercy! What a perfect Lenten practice that is!

Let's reflect on the concept of mercy, not just for our enemy but for ourselves. In praying for another we reflect the mercy that has been granted us when we (human beings) too, have been an enemy of God (Romans 5: 10-21). How can we expect to receive it if we cannot give it away?

Love your neighbor. Love your enemies. Pray for those who persecute you. The Lord is simply asking us to be like Him. And that's a very good thing!






