

#### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR My dear parishioners,

In fact, Catholic parishbased schools began with St. John Neumann, the Fourth Bishop of Philadelphia, in response to the openly anti-Catholic sentiments expressed in the public schools at that time. Bishop Neumann, as a wise pastor, wanted to preserve and strengthen the faith of his flock, especially the youngest. As the culture changes in America today, I see as a pastor the need for Catholic education more than

senior citizens and those suffering from physical afflictions. The Chapter, Towards a Listening and Accompanying Church notes that, "the elderly and the sick are often invisible in society. We encourage parishes and Christian communities to be close to them and listen to them. Works of mercy inspired by the Gospel words, "I was sick, and you visited me.' (Mt 25:39) have a profound significance for the people involved and for fostering the wider bonds of community."

The Synod's desire to encourage support for the elderly and ill in a way that upholds their dignity, calls to mind the great gift that retired our retired priests.

During their many years of active ministry, these men devotedly brought the presence of Christ to countless individuals through the celebration of the Sacraments, preaching, teaching, and charitable actions. In retirement, they continue to be a great source of spiritual support, through their prayers, the celebration of Holy Mass, working in various ministries, and their wise counsel.

Today, one-third of our priests are retired. Many continue in some degree of active service to our parishes as much as their health allows. Others, due to advanced age and medical conditions, live quietly and offer prayers for you, the people of our local Church.



#### If Not Now, When?

 $\hbox{{\it ''}$Reproductive Liberty" is yet anoth-}\\$ er pro-abort clever and devious marketing ploy making the killing of an unborn human seem like clearly the right thing to allow. The bill currently being considered in the PA Judiciary Committee would amend the Pennsylvania Constitution to maintain the "right" for an abortion at any time for any reason throughout a pregnancy (including the 9th month). It would strip away all the protections of the PA Abortion Control Act, including parental consent, informed consent (where 24 hours prior to an abortion a woman must be provided information about the nature of the procedure, gestational age, and alternatives to abortion), reporting (each abortion performed must be reportedIn detail to the state), and abortion cannot be performed after 24 weeks, unless the woman's life or health Is endangered.

A Reproductive l.iberty (killing the unborn for any reason) constitutional amendment would prevent future pro-life laws from being passed. Although there are many steps before such a bill could ever go through the process and become a permanentamendment to the PA Constitution, the time to act is NOW. If not now, when? We need to vote pro-life, speak pro-life, to inform elected officials that we're watching, and keep supporting pro-life candidates.


#### Join the "St. Martha Ministry"




