


Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday)

March 10, 2024



"Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done by God."
John 3: 21



A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

This is the Fourth Sunday of Lent, which the Church calls "Laetare Sunday." The name is taken from the entrance antiphon for the Mass of that day, which starts with the Latin word "Laetare," which is a command or insistence to "rejoice." The day is accompanied by the change in color of the priest's vestments, from the dark color purple to the brighter one of rose.

What's it all mean? Well, here we are a little better than mid-way in the journey of Lent. That time of mental, physical and spiritual reorganization of priorities in our life. To see once again what really matters.

After all, the journey of Lent mirrors each of our lives, doesn't it? For we are on a journey and while it may have many hardships, calls for many sacrifices, and eventually leads to our death, nonetheless there is hope and light at the end of it all. Just as there was for Jesus. His cross like ours, faithfully carried, leads to the resurrection.

The change of color in the priest's vestments is meant to signify that in the midst of suffering, pain and hardship, there can be hope. The darkness of purple, in other words, is lightened to a pink or rose. It's like mixing up paint colors. When we feel the color of the paint we chose for a wall in our house is too dark and depressing, we often lighten it with a little white or some other bright color.

And that mirrors the life of every Christian, does it not? For in our lives there are many sad, depressing and even dark moments. But mingled with that oppression is the bright hope that we have as followers of Jesus that Easter, which His resurrection reveals in all of its splendor, is not far away. For Easter reminds us that death is not the final word. Defeat is not the last chapter, for God can hardly wait to pull back the curtain of this life, and show us what He has waiting for us, and all those we love.

In Jesus' reference to a grain of wheat falling to the ground, He wishes to point out that His is a life that is about to be destroyed, a "word" that is about to be silenced. Thus instead of seeing glory in human form, they stand before a "glory" that reveals itself through suffering and death. This is true for them, but it is also true for every Christian community. To serve the name of the Lord, welcome the request of those who "seek Him", and bring these seekers to Jesus.



So in the meantime, Laetare Sunday challenges us to get back to our Lenten sacrifices if we have failed. Muster the courage to make a good confession, if we have been away for years. Forgive an enemy. Try talking again to someone with whom you have been angry. Pick up your cross, and see the light at the end of the tunnel, which starts to shine ever so slightly along the way to Calvary, with Jesus, our Savior.



Guest Preacher: Most Rev. Christopher R. Cooke



Bishop Cooke joined the faculty at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in June 2013, and currently serves as the Dean of Men for the Theology Seminary. From 2013 to 2021, he was Director of the Spiritual Year program. He also serves on the Theology formation team. Pope Francis appointed Cooke, along with Fr. Keith J. Chylinski and Fr. Ephren V. Esmilla, to be Auxiliary Bishops for Philadelphia on Dec. 8, 2023.

Since Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez performed the Episcopal Ordination of the three Bishops on March 7, 2024, at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul in Philadelphia, this will be the first Parish Mission for Bishop Cooke!

He began his priestly formation at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary and earned master's degrees in 2005 and 2006, and was ordained to the priesthood on May 20, 2006.

Previously Bishop Cooke served in the parishes of St. Eleanor, Collegeville; St. Martin of Tours, Philadelphia, and St. Francis of Assisi parish, Norristown. His home parish is St. Vincent de Paul in Richboro.

Dear Missionary Disciples,

May your fourth week of Lent be fruitful. Happy Laetare Sunday! *Laetare* is the Latin word meaning “rejoice.” On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent’s Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. The priests wear rose vestments. This change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide. (<https://www.simplycatholic.com/laetare-sunday/>) Take courage and continue to pray, fast and give with all your heart, mind and soul. I hope the journaling is helping you to draw closer to God.

Story of Our Lady: Our Lady of Sorrows- The Blessed Virgin Mary has promised to grant seven graces to the souls who honor her daily by saying seven Hail Marys and meditating on her tears and sorrows. Here is the prayer: Each group of the seven sorrows is begun with an Our Father, as in the regular Rosary. You may consider starting with an Act of Contrition since the devotion has a penitential aspect. The groups of seven Hail Marys are an occasion for meditation on each of the Seven Sorrows of Mary: 1) the prophecy of Simeon (St. Luke 2:34, 35); 2) the flight into Egypt. (St. Matthew 2:13, 14); 3) the loss of the Child Jesus in the temple (St. Luke 2: 43-45); 4) the meeting of Jesus and Mary on the Way of the Cross; 5) the Crucifixion; 6) the taking down of the Body of Jesus from the Cross; and 7) the burial of Jesus. 




