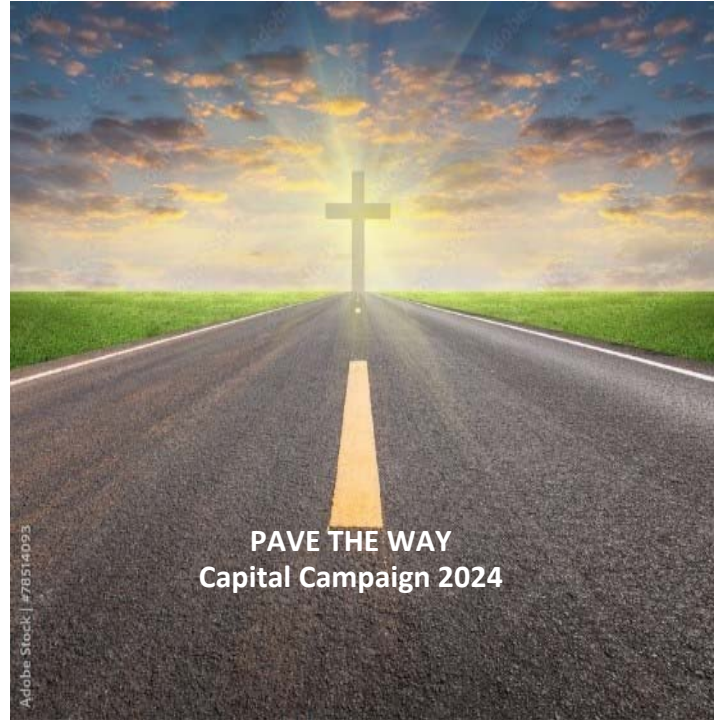
My dear parishioners,

As you know a few months ago, our parish embarked on an historic Capital Campaign to finance a major capital project. The campaign was entitled, "Pave the Way." The original parking lot constructed during the time of our founding pastor Fr. James Martin served us so well for close to 60 years. But it is now in need of reconstruction.

For several years we've had potholes filled in, and resurfacing done, but members of our Building and Grounds Committee recently recommended total replacement. After a thorough bidding process, which involved five different companies, our Building and Grounds Committee recommended awarding the project to **Meco Constructors, Inc.**

Having reached the required threshold of 80 percent of the projected construction costs in cash and/or pledges, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia has granted permission for our parish to proceed with the project. At the present time, negotiations on the contract are being worked out between the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and Meco Constructors. I expect a contract to come to my desk very soon, for my signature, so the project can begin in the first week of August, as planned. The contract is prepared by the Archdiocese's attorneys to protect the parish, and the Archdiocese.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all those who contributed or have made pledge contributions to the "Pave the Way" campaign. It is comforting, if not amazing, to see how fast we made it to 84 percent (as of June 26, 2024). There is still some way to go to the finish line. And



so I encourage all who can participate to kindly, if possible, do so as soon as possible.

One of the questions that I keep hearing is, "Will the spaces be made larger? Because our vehicles are larger these days." The answer is while they will not be made larger, they will not be made smaller. This is due to the ratio of parking spaces to seating capacity of our church, required by township law, as well as the amount of imper-vious space required for our campus.

I promise to keep everyone informed of parking restrictions and availability when we get closer to actual construction in early August. Thank you again for your tremendous patience, understanding and support, as we "Pave the Way" to Christ!

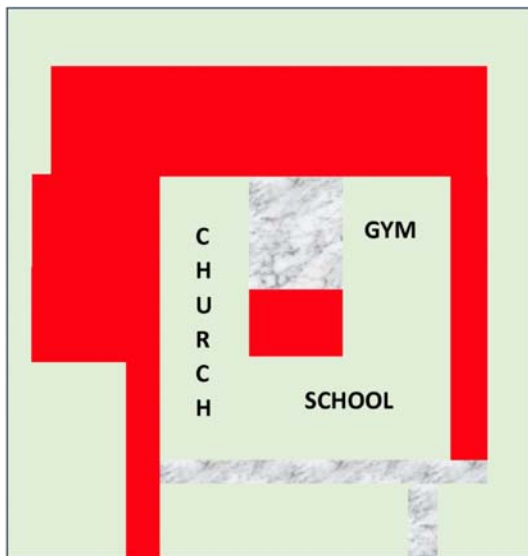

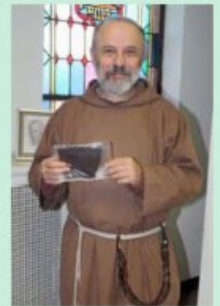

Please join with us at the vigil as we give thanks to God for answered prayers and His providence in saving the lives of our unborn brothers and sisters.

Bishop Calls Saving Babies from Abortion "The Civil Rights Issue of Our Time"

Bishop Michael Burbidge, on behalf of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) recently released a statement celebrating the anniversary of the Supreme Court's *Dobbs* decision, which overturned the previous ruling of *Roe v. Wade*.

As Bishop of Arlington and Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities, Bishop Burbidge has been an outspoken champion of the right to life, calling abortion the "preeminent civil rights issue of our time," as CatholicVote recently reported. In his statement on the anniversary of Dobbs, he urges American Catholics to continue defending life.

He reminds Catholics that, while Dobbs has opened more opportunities for defending life, some states have "enacted extreme abortion policies. Children have been left vulnerable to abortion until the moment of birth." Because of these threats to unborn life, Bishop Burbidge encourages Catholic citizens "to engage their elected officials on all issues endangering life."

The Bishop also reminds Catholics that the National Eucharistic Revival, including the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and the National Eucharistic Congress, should be a source of strength when navigating difficult political issues.

"Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist has the power to transform our own hearts and the heart of our culture," says Bishop Burbidge. "Strengthened by our Eucharistic Lord, each of us must rededicate ourselves to serving the cause of life."

Catholics can help the unborn by supporting ministries like Walking With Moms in Need, the Bishop says, thanking "the countless individual Catholics who have dedicated themselves to parish and community initiatives."

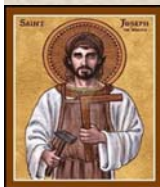

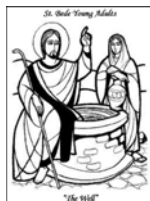

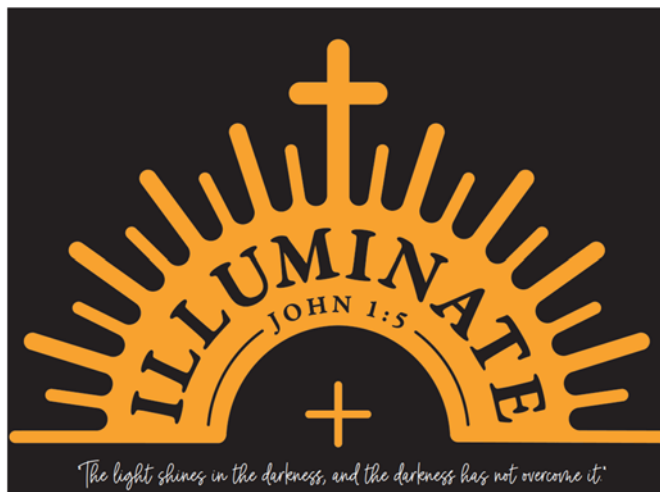
