A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

The world needs better leadership. For all the time we spend talking about leadership, studying leadership, writing about leadership, we do not seem to be making much of a difference. We experience the effects of bad leadership in our workplaces and communities, and even in our country. When will things ever improve?

St. Benedict, the founder of Western Monasticism, understands our problem. In his own lifetime, he saw a lot of bad leadership all around him. The world as he knew it was coming undone because the leaders of his age could not manage the challenges before them.

So Benedict wrote rules for his monks, and in the rules we discover that what he is doing is applying the Bible to the practical matters that faced his community. Something we should all do. Throughout the Bible, the main image for a leader is a shepherd. Shepherds were never folks high on the social ladder, which may seem surprising.

For Benedict, being a leader was not about being high in stature, but about being a servant. Shepherds most often cared for sheep that were not their own. In fact, they were even asked to risk their own lives to protect them. Christ, our Shepherd, always acknowledged that His sheep, His disciples and followers, belong to God, His Father. He died to protect us as a good shepherd would, from sin and death.

Benedict also understood that leaders need to provide those under them with what each one of them needed to make progress. Looking at Christ in the Gospel for this weekend, we see that He wanted to give the disciples some rest after the demanding work they had accomplished. Jesus sent the disciples on a mission to challenge

them and give them confidence. And now He saw that they needed rest, and time to reflect with each other on what they had learned from their experiences. A true shepherd adapts to the situation, which is why Christ the Shepherd would leave 99 sheep to themselves to focus to one lost sheep. Each sheep was important.

Too often our leaders are not the people they make themselves appear to be. Benedict was aware of this too, so for him, leaders of monastic communities were to lead by example.

Once, such a teaching moment arose in the Gospel for this Sunday, when crowds of people followed Jesus and His apostles. Jesus could have tried to lose them. Or He could have chased them away. But as a good leader, He considered what example that would set for His disciples. If He truly came to tend to the lost sheep of Israel and prepare His disciples to do the same, He needed to change His plan. So as a Good Shepherd, Christ fed the people rather than rest.

Let us keep this Gospel in mind, especially if we are called to leadership in our families, at work, or as a coach. Or in so many other ways that come up in life. And finally, may God raise up men and women among our citizens, who will lead, like Christ, this great country of ours.

Cornerstone for Life

Natural Family Planning Honors God's Design for Married Love and Life

As a practical and ethical aid in married life, the practice of Natural Family Planning (NFP) intersects with the deepest levels of the spousal relationship. In the words of St. John Paul II, NFP is "a valuable help to responsible parenthood, in which all individuals, and in the first place the child, are recognized and respected in their own right and where every decision is guided by the ideal of the sincere gift of self." (*Evangelium vitae*, 88)

A theology of NFP must include prayerful reflection on the teachings of the Catholic Church about God's creation of men and women in His image, the meaning of human sexuality, marriage, conjugal love and responsible parenthood. The U.S. bishops emphasize the importance of this theological reflection in their document, *Married Love and the Gift of Life*:

"Married love differs from any other love in the world. By its nature, the love of husband and wife is so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with God and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being they will love and care for together. Part of God's gift to husband and wife is this ability in and through their love to cooperate with God's creative power. Therefore, the mutual gift of fertility is an integral part of the bonding power of married intercourse. That power to create a new life with God is at the heart of what spouses share with each other." (*USCCB, Married Love and the Gift of Life*, 2006)

Natural Family Planning (NFP) is the general title for the scientific, natural, and moral methods of family planning that can help married couples either achieve or postpone pregnancy. Since the methods of NFP respect the love-giving and life-giving nature of the conjugal act, they support God's design for married love!




