

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

Starting two Sundays ago, and continuing through this month, we begin a series of weeks where we hear from St. John's Gospel, with passages from what is known as "The Bread of Life Discourse." How appropriate and timely that we hear these reading during this National Eucharistic

Revival, taking place in the United States of America. In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus speaks of Himself as "The Bread, come down from heaven." The Jewish people to whom He first spoke these words would have known intensely the stories of the Manna, coming down from heaven during the Exodus. So one can understand why they would find Jesus' words puzzling and strange. And murmur about them to one another.

After all, Jesus was clearly not bread, but flesh and blood, standing before them. And Jesus could not have come down from heaven because, as they point out, they know His parents from their town. So was Jesus lying? Was He confused? But Jesus did not back away from what He said, nor apologize if He offended them.

Why should He, and why should we think of backing off of His words, when others confront us by saying that, "The Eucharist is just a piece of bread, made here on earth? It's not from heaven." All of Jesus' words could be debated, except for one important fact that is a game changer: Jesus rose from the dead. And hundreds who saw Him risen would not back off from proclaiming it. His resurrection confirms all that He said and all that He did throughout His life.

Scripture Readings for Next Sunday 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 18, 2024

Proverbs 9: 1-6

Psalm 34: 2-7 Ephesians 5: 15-20

Ephesians 5: 15-2 John 6: 51-58

Saint Paul once again provides us a key insight into our celebration. We are to "be filled with the Spirit . . . giving thanks always and for everything." Knowing that "Eucharist" means to give thanks, let us listen to these readings, grateful for God's holy word and eager to respond in the Eucharist to which Jesus invites us.



And that is why we believe that He is the Bread of Life, come down from heaven. Because He said at the Last Supper, "This is My Body," and to His apostles, "Do this is memory of Me," we can be sure that the incarnate Word of God is still present among us, really and substantially, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, at every Mass.

Yes at every reception of Holy Communion, the Son of God takes up residence in our hearts, to rule and guide us. Like Mary, whose Assumption into heaven we celebrate this week, we carry Him in our own body, as she did. What an honor, when you think of it! But what a responsibility it entails.

For like Mary, we are now called to be true disciples, carrying His message, His example, His hope. Not only for ourselves, but for all we meet in this world, which has so often lost its hope and its direction. As we come forth to receive Jesus or kneel before Him in adoration, let us do so with hearts hungry for His forgiveness, His love and His strength, to love and sacrifice as He did.



St. Bede Padre Pio Prayer Group Meets August 13



Paving Has Begun!



The Capital Campaign Drive for our Parking Lot repaving project continues to be a success! At this time, over 90 percent of our goal has been reached, and work began this past Wednesday.

You can still contribute to the Drive - just drop your contribution in the Sunday Collection.

We will continue to provide updates on the paving's progress. Until then, we offer the following information to all parishioners and visitors, since the construction will temporarily impact our lives:

- Work on the Parking Lot will start on Wednesday August 7, weather permitting. It will be completed within 2 ½ to 3 weeks.
- 2. Paving will be done from 7:00am to around 3:00pm, Monday to Friday.
- 3. Work will be done in phases there will always be a part of the parking lot that will be open.
- 4. Work will be planned to not interfere with the 9:00am Mass, and any funerals that may come up.
- There will be access to all buildings (church, school, Drexel Center, Adoration Chapel) at all times. But not all entrances will be open, and there may be a distance from available parking.
- There will be access to the soccer fields for evening practices and games.
- Meco will provide regular scheduling information on which sections will be under construction.
- Noise- Milling is very noisy. Meco will schedule to, as much as possible, avoid milling in the area around the day chapel or church during Daily Mass or funerals.
- Please avoid the active construction areas! Meco will mark work areas with visible barrier installation and maintenance in the form of post stanchions and caution tape.
- During much of the construction, parking spaces will not be marked. Please use extra caution when driving and parking especially for Weekend Masses.



OCIA STORIES OF FAITH

O.C.I.A Stories of Faith is an outreach of St. Bede the Venerable to open the doors to the Catholic Church by explaining the O.C.I.A process to our community and spreading the stories of our parish members who have participated in the program here or as part of their own personal faith journey into full communion with the Catholic Church.

What is O.C.I.A.? ? (Previously named R.C.I.A)

O. C. I. A. stands for the Order of the Christian Initiation of Adults. The USCCB changed the name from R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) to OCIA to better represent the Latin name (Ordo Initiationis Christianae Adultorum) and the new curriculum approved in 2022. OCIA is the process established by the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. This initiation process involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Order speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." St. Bede's 2024 O.C.I.A. program runs from September 19 to May 1 on Thursday nights at 7:00 pm in the Drexel Center. Who is O.C.I.A. for? (Previously named

1. Persons interested in exploring the Catholic faith; 2. Persons in need of Baptism; 3. Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic; and 4. Persons baptized Catholic in need of First

Communion and/or Confirmation.

STORY OF FAITH- BRIGHAM "JOSEPH" BREINER (57. BEDE MISSIONARY DISCIPLE) Who or what led you to enter the OCIA

I grew up in a Protestant family, Methodist and Baptist, "being saved" as a Christian. I had a strong faith throughout my childhood years, up until a life changing event occurred and I lost my connection with God. Fast forward to today, May 17, 2023, my Wedding

Anniversary. My wife and I have been married for 26 years. I spent many years during our marriage going to church with my wife and children only on the holidays. I never felt that I belonged at a Catholic church while I was with my family, even though I wanted to. Over the years, I wanted to reach out to Monsignor D'Angelico from Our Lady of Good Counsel, which was my family's parish at the time. However, I never did. I was not fully ready at that point in my life.

When my daughter met Father Ryan (Then, Deacon Ryan) on her Steubenville retreat that eventually led to a friendship between Father Ryan and my family. I finally realized after all that time that I needed something more in my life and that "something" was that I needed to strengthen my relationship with God. So, I made a personal decision to join the RCIA program at Saint Bede Parish in September 2022.

Was there any point of the process that you found helpful?

I really enjoyed the Symbolon videos that we needed to watch weekly to prepare for class. I found them very informative and easy to understand in learning the faith. Shawn Tobin was "awesome, awesome" in cheering us on, and keeping us on track with a weekly email on what we needed to do to prepare for the upcoming classes. All the catechists who gave their time to come to class were always very knowledgeable and supportive. I had many conversations with both Monsignor Marine

and Father Ryan inside and outside of class. They were always very helpful and an inspiration to me. I would also like to mention Seminarians Drew and Santiago. They were very friendly and knowledgeable and brought a different perspective into the group.

What would you tell someone who might be inquiring about the Catholic faith or the OCIA Process? "Don't Wait", "Getter Done". It is a faith process that is by far the most important thing to bring anyone closer to God. As Monsignor Marine would say, "You will receive the full banquet...appetizer, entree, and dessert".

How has the OCIA program helped you understand your faith and grow closer to God? The discussions with the group taught me to further understand my relationship with God, through the eyes of the Catholic Church, and helped me to build upon my current beliefs as a Christian.

How do you plan to live out your faith going forward? I would like to continue to grow closer to God in prayer. I would also like to continue to grow closer to my family through my faith, and to help others to know Jesus, how I have come to know him, especially when they don't think it could be possible

What is your favorite story in the Bible or about the Catholic faith? I love the story about when Jesus spoke to the thousands. The people came from afar just to hear him speak. They were hungry and he turned a small amount of food into more than enough to feed them all!

If you were to write a story about your faith journey what would be the title of your story?

Iowa's Heatbeat Abortion Ban Takes Effect

Thousands of unborn babies will likely be saved in Iowa now that the state of Iowa's heartbeat law has finally taken effect today after years of legal battles.

The law, which Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds signed in July 2023, bans abortion once a baby's heartbeat can be detected, which is as early as five weeks of pregnancy.

The governor had signed a similar heartbeat ban in 2018, but the Iowa Supreme Court failed to uphold it in a deadlocked 3-3 ruling on procedural grounds last year, and it never took effect.

However, the court ruled in favor of the new heartbeat law in a 4-3 decision this month in a victory for pro-lifers.

The Iowa Supreme Court, which has a 7-0 Republican majority, had declared in 2022 that Iowa's Constitution does not include a "fundamental right" to abortion, reversing an earlier pro-abortion precedent.

Unlike some states that have enacted pro-life protections, Iowa does not allow initiated constitutional amendments that could overturn its heartbeat ban.

Conservative leaders celebrated the Iowa Supreme Court's decision to uphold the law, which is the strongest pro-life legislation to take effect in the Hawkeye State in more than 50 years, while calling for the state to protect life from the moment of conception.

In states where they have been enforced, heartbeat laws have reduced abortions by around 50 percent, as in Georgia, to nearly 80 percent, as in South Carolina.




