




A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

Take another look at that front cover of today's parish bulletin. It shows the magnificent double rainbow that was seen in the sky the Saturday night before the annual Padre Pio Festival weekend. To me it was like a foreshadowing of the many blessings that were soon to come in seven days when we, as a parish, hosted a grand celebration in his honor.

As you look through the many beautiful photos taken by Gary Gehringer, our parish photographer, you get a glimpse of all the special moments: Saturday's parish picnic, Saturday evening's fabulous concert by the Jersey Tenors, Sunday's standing room only celebration of Mass, the largest ever crowd of faithful walking in the street procession, the hundreds of people who came from all over for the healing service and the delicious food, fun and games for the kids.

I was told numerous times over the weekend by so many visitors who joined us, that very few parishes "could pull this off" (as they put it), something so big and so well organized as our Padre Pio Festival. Story of Our Lady of Walsingham: Our Lady appeared to Lady Richeldis and showed her a picture of the Holy Family's house in Nazareth and asked her to erect another in Walsingham. The Shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham was established around 1061 to be memorial to the Annunciation from the Archangel Gabriel that Mary would be the mother of God's Son in virginity. In 1528, the Reformation caused the property of the Shrine in Walsingham, UK to be burnt down and handed over to the King. Then 369 years later in 1897, the Chapel was restored and rededicated by Pope Leo XII.

Walsingham is now the site of three shrines to Our Lady of Walsingham and the Holy Family, one Catholic, one Orthodox and one Anglican. Our Lady of Walingsham is hope for our generation that no matter how the world changes, with enough time, prayer and hope, the Catholic faith will be restored. Furthermore, she is a hope for Christian unity since the Orthodox and Anglicans venerate her as well. Check out the following QR code for more information on Our Lady of Walsingham.






St. John Neumann Boot Drive

Saint John's Hospice (SJH) is hosting its annual Saint John Neumann Boot Drive to benefit men experiencing homelessness.

SJH, part of the Housing and Homeless Services Division of CSS, provides crucial, life-sustaining services with dignity, respect and compassion to homeless men in Philadelphia. This annual boot drive enables SJH to purchase basic necessities for men in need.

A donation of just \$25 can provide a new pair of boots, socks, and undergarments to a homeless man in need. A gift of \$100 can provide four men experiencing homelessness with boots, socks, and undergarments. Remaining funds will help SJH's annual appeal and benefit the SJH's Residential Program, Coffee House, and Day Services Programs, as well as its Good Shepherd Program, a residential program offering housing and social services to homeless men who are medically fragile.
