
So what's going on in front of the school?

For every problem, there is a solution! Recently the school was experiencing some water problems when it rained. Water was coming into some of the first floor classrooms, so a solution was needed.





With the wise guidance of John Eccleston, Rich Bergen, our Maintenance Supervisor, addressed the problem by first having a contractor waterproof the outside wall of the classrooms. A "French Drain," a perforated pipe surrounded by gravel along the bottom of the wall, was then installed. During rainstorms, the gravel will direct the water into the pipe, which then re-directs the water to the school's sewer drain.




