A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

It was only a mere three weeks ago when I wrote in this column about the magnificent Padre Pio Festival we as a parish celebrated with such care and hard work on the part of so many. That festival enabled hundreds of people to find comfort and peace through honoring that great saint.

Now I cannot let the opportunity pass to express my joy, gratitude and humble pride once again over the splendid spiritual blessing our parish, and those who joined us, experienced during last week's Annual Forty Hours Devotion. The pictures in today's bulletin on pages 6 and 7 give you a glimpse of the many highlights of the three days and nights when we as a parish turned our attention so closely on this wondrous gift that Jesus left us, in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Fr. Henry Graebe, who preached so many powerful homilies throughout the three days and nights set the tone. At Sunday night's devotion, he explained that our celebration of Mass is vastly different from other services conducted by other religions because as he said, "At a Catholic Mass, we are mysteriously yet truly transported to the foot of the cross on Calvary. To experience for ourselves and in our time what God did through His Son Jesus, in giving His Body and Blood to redeem us."

Fr. Graebe went on to explain that everything in human history revolves around the Good News that "God loved this world so much that He gave His only begotten Son." He said, "At Mass we are made present 'in our time' at that sacrifice, to receive the benefits meant to transform us into disciples."

I was personally edified by Fr. Graebe's homilies, but also by the great number of people who came all hours of the day and night to pray before Jesus in the Eucharist. I was also impressed by many people who came to confession. But without a doubt the most memorable part of the three days was the sight of the full church at the Closing Night ceremony. There were so many families present, accompanied by their children which, as a pastor, delighted my heart.

In fact when I knelt down at the kneeler in the front of the outside altar in the back of the church where the candlelight procession ended, Chris Fyke, the Master of Ceremonies that night, said "Monsignor, I was just told that the last people in the procession just left the church." That made me realize that it was the largest crowd we ever had for a Forty Hours Devotion.



As we walked behind Jesus with our candles into the darkness, I believe it served as a metaphor for the present time in history. For the world seems very dark just now. Our only hope is Jesus, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. May we follow Him in all of our decisions. And with Him, in our hearts in Holy Communion, become the light of the world.

Epic: The Early Church

You will learn the stories behind the first ecumenical councils and the Roman persecutions and meet many of the men and women who gave their lives to defend the Faith. The heroic stories of the early leaders and martyrs of the Church will strengthen and affirm your own walk of faith.

The Student Workbook includes:

- ◆ An overview of each session
- ◆ Quick quizzes to help remember the most essential points
- ◆ Talk notes to guide participants through the video presentation

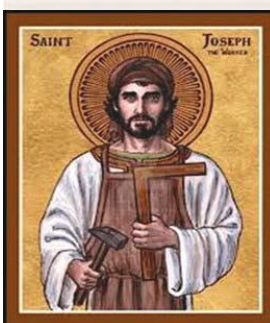

Hello Everyone

We are getting into the meat of our programming for the Fall. There are several programs you need to be aware of.

First is the Triple T meetings on Thursday nights. Triple T stands for Teen Topic Thursdays. These are nights for High Schoolers to come together to discuss the Gospel readings and any other topics that affect them as Teens. The teens that come to Triple T seem to truly form a community that prayerfully looks out for each other and navigates the journey through their Faith together. This year the teens decided that they want to do a program from YDisciple called Created and Claimed. This series will last 6 weeks. The series ask teens to look at their identity in Christ, looking beyond what the culture tells them. Triple T meets every Thursday at 6pm in the Youth Center. This group in the past met on Sunday, the day the group will meet this year depends on the participants scheduled. Lastly is the ANCHORED, Guys Group. This group is for guys in grades 7 to 10th. The group will watch a series of YDisciple videos with the focus on Manhood and they discuss various topics. Topics include Dating, Brotherhood, chastity and much, much more. The group met on Sunday right after the 12:30 Mass, this year the group of guys will decided which day of the week works best for them.
