My dear parishioners,

One of the responsibilities all of us have as members of Christ's Catholic Church is to foster and promote vocations to the priesthood. When I said "all of us" I really do mean all of us! Here at St. Bede's

Several of the Parochial Vicars assigned here have been newly ordained priests, fresh out of the seminary. Their youthful energy and apostolic zeal has brought so much life to St. Bede Parish. Not every parish has been so fortunate.


It is no secret that there are less priests in our Archdiocese than when I was ordained in 1976. Yet the need is just as great, if not greater, to minister to all of the pastoral needs of our people, with the celebration of Mass, hearing confessions, anointing the sick, etc.

It is our time as a parish to begin to give back. As pastor I have tried to make it a priority to foster vocations and to invite you to be a part of that mission as well. In fact for the last six years, we have concluded the intercessions at Mass with a Prayer for Vocations. By now, we all know the prayer by heart.

While I encourage you to invite someone you know from your family or someone you see in the parish to consider the priesthood by asking them, "Have you ever thought about being a priest? Because I think you would make a good one." Nonetheless, another way to promote vocations is by offering time in prayer before the Lord, in Eucharistic Adoration.

The Archdiocesan Vocation Office has begun a new vocational initiative during this time of Eucharistic Revival. Certain parishes in each region have been selected to provide a place for people to come on a Thursday for Eucharistic Adoration, for the purpose of prayer for vocations.







The St. Bede Perpetual Adoration Chapel is located directly next to the Drexel Center, on the parish campus



• Our 4th graders also helped clean up our campus and wrote thank you cards to Northampton Public Service workers.


• Our 5th grade students wrote thank you cards to our Northampton Police Officers and they will be collecting Halloween candy for our troops.

EDUCATIONAL IMPROVEMENT TAX CREDIT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

YOU CAN CHANGE A CHILD'S LIFE FOR GOOD

What types of taxes can be offset by this credit?

Individuals who pay Pennsylvania income taxes and businesses that are authorized to do business in Pennsylvania who are subject to one or more of the following taxes:

1. Personal Income Tax --- Sub-chapter S-corporations and other "pass-through" entities will be able to use the credit against the shareholders', members', or partners' PA personal income taxes

- 2. Corporate Net Income Tax
- 3. Malt Beverage Tax
- 4. Bank and Trust Company Shares Tax
- Insurance Premiums Tax (excluding surplus lines, unauthorized, domestic/ foreign marine)
- 6. Mutual Thrift Institutions Tax
- 7. Title Insurance Companies Shares Tax
- 8. Retaliatory Fees under section 212 of the insurance company Law of 1921

Sample Tax Calculations


