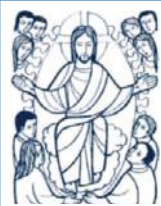

***Baptism*** - Usually celebrated on 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, at 1:30pm. MANDATORY Pre-Jordan Classes are held on the 2nd Sunday of the month, at 12:15pm. PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED - please call the Parish Office to make arrangements (215-357-5720).

***Marriage*** - Saturday weddings are 10:00AM, 12:00 Noon, & 2:00 PM. It is Diocesan policy that arrangements must be made AT LEAST 6 MONTHS prior to the wedding. Information on Marriage Instructions can be obtained from the priests. For information on music, call Susan DiFlorio at 215-891-0869.

***Anointing of the Sick*** - In case of serious illness (or advanced age), please call the priests.

Hospital cases should contact the Chaplain, but the Parish Office should be notified so one of the priests may visit the patient.

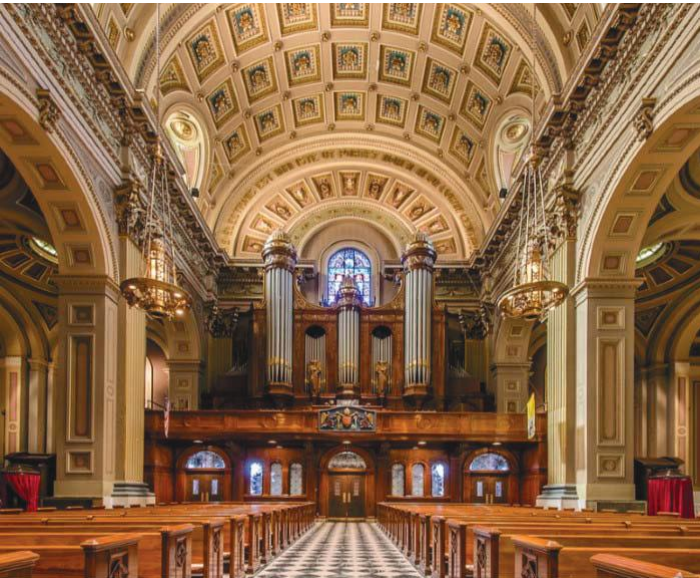

Thanksgiving is next week. Consider coming out to the Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9am to thank God for all the blessings you have received in 2024. Thankfulness is one of the key ingredients to nurturing and developing your relationship with God, family and neighbor. Even if you can't make the Thanksgiving Day Mass, consider thanking God each day for all the great things he has done for you and your family. Likewise, take the time to thank your spouse, children, friends and family on a regular basis for any good thing they have done for you. The scriptures are clear about the fruit of thankfulness and when we should be thankful. *"In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus."* (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

And even some scientific research backs the health benefits of thankfulness or gratitude, with the most thankful people having 9% less chance of dying in the next 4 year of their life. See QR code to the right for website on research.



## Story of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal:



In the summer of 1830, Our Lady came to Sister Catherine Laboure. She appeared to her several times and, on November 27, 1830, asked her to make a medal in honor of her title as the Immaculate Conception. Sister Catherine saw an oval frame formed around her, bearing the words, "O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." After two years, the medal was made and distributed to the public under the title of the Medal of the Immaculate Conception. However, there were so many miracles that occurred when people wore the medal and asked Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception to pray for them, that the Medal of the Immaculate Conception was quickly named the Miraculous Medal and the name has stuck almost 200 years later. On the front, the medal shows Our Mother Mary standing on the globe (Mary, assumed into heaven, is the Queen of Heaven and Earth), as her feet stand on the head of the serpent (Mary is our protection from evil). The oval-shaped medal is circled with the signature, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." On the back of the medal, there are twelve stars (12 Apostles who formed the first Church) that surround a large "M" from which a cross (Jesus' Cross and Redemption) arises. Mary is always connected to Jesus and remained faithful to him even to the foot of the Cross. And below the "M" are two flaming hearts (the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary burning with love for us). The Sacred Heart is circled with thorns (Jesus who suffered and died for our sins). The Immaculate Heart, pierced by a sword ("and a sword will pierce your heart" Lk 2:35), symbolizes Mary, who intercedes for us. This medal was made 24 years before the Church officially declared Our Lady as the Immaculate Conception in 1854. The Feast of Our

Lady of the Miraculous Medal is November 27<sup>th</sup> and the Feast of now Saint Catherine Laboure is November 28<sup>th</sup>. (Information taken from the Best Catholic.Com - use QR code to access). Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, pray for us who have recourse to you! Furthermore, Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception is the Patroness of America. Please ask her to pray for America, our government and all of our political and military leaders.

Hello Everyone,

The teens who gather for Triple T each week on Thursday's have been watching a YDisciple video series called **Created & Claimed**. We are really enjoying it. Each video looks at faith through the lens of a teenager who is looking for their purpose and identity in life. Here are some of the questions we have discussed after viewing segments of the videos (Parents: not judging but where is your teen having these type of discussions? Are they getting Christ-centered responses? — PLEASE feel free to discuss these questions with your teen and/or have your teen come out to Triple T on Thursday)

- Do you find it easy or difficult to believe that human beings are created good?
- Looking at the world around you and at your own life, does it always seem like we're made good (as God tells us in the creation story)?
- How does it make you feel hearing that you belong in God's family and that you have been claimed by Him?
- What would it look like if you were a saint in your present place and time?
- What makes a good relationship?
- What's the difference between letting relationships inform our identity and letting other people tell us who we are?
- How do you define love?
- What does it look like for a relationship to be transactional?
- Do you believe that God loves you?

We have run other groups besides Triple T to allow for youth to come together and explore the topics that are important to them. In September I asked if there is interest in **the Anchored Guys group and the Blaze Girls group**. I received very few responses. These groups are for youth in grades 7 to 10. The sessions focus on: relationships, love, manhood, chastity, God's purpose for your life and dispelling the lies that the world tells us vs. the truths of Christ. If you have a teen that would be interested in these groups OR you want more information PLEASE reach out to me. **Once I have a group that is interested we will select a meeting day of the week and time that works for all.**
