A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on an exciting and significant development in the life of our parish. For the last seven years, one of our parishioners **Matt Ruel**, has been enrolled in the Formation Program at St. Charles Seminary, which prepares men to be ordained as a Permanent Deacon.

A Permanent Deacon is an individual of good moral character, often already married and involved in the life of his parish, and who feels called to serve the Church in this ordained ministry of Holy Orders. Permanent Deacons assist the priests of the parish not only at the altar, but also and perhaps even more importantly in various roles of charity, adult education, and wherever there is a need.

Permanent Deacons can preach at Masses, baptize and, when necessary, witness vows at a wedding. However, they do not hear confessions, anoint the sick or celebrate Holy Mass. Matt has been attending classes at St. Charles Seminary over the course of these last seven years, pursuing studies in pastoral, scriptural, sacramental, and moral theology.

We have not seen him on the weekends for the last two years because Archbishop Perez assigned him to assist on the weekends at nearby St. Vincent DePaul Parish and St. Andrew Parish in Newtown. The reason for this is that men studying for the Permanent Diaconate in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia must realize that they are being ordained for service to the Church of Philadelphia,

and not just the parish to which they belong. It does happen that if there are no other Permanent Deacons assigned to a parish, the newly ordained deacon may very well be assigned to his parish. But it is no guarantee. Certainly we hope that when Matt Ruel's preparation is over and he receives the call from Archbishop Perez this spring that he will be allowed to serve here at St. Bede. We will certainly appreciate and utilize his service.

In the meantime we join with Matt and his dear wife Rachel during the final months of prayer, examination and preparation for his ordination to the Diaconate, which again, upon the call of Archbishop Perez, will take place on Saturday June 14. We thank Matt for his willingness to respond to God's call, and for Rachel's support of his vocation.

Religious Education

Dear Missionary Disciples,

This week we have a couple of very special days! February 11th is the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. This day commemorates Our Blessed Mother's first apparition to St. Bernadette Soubirous. Many of us know the story of how Our Blessed Mother appeared to a poor, young girl in Lourdes, France. Mary encouraged Bernadette to pray the Rosary and revealed her name to her, Immaculate Conception. Since the apparitions, thousands of people who have prayed for the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes and have bathed in the waters at the Shrine have been cured. In 1992, February 11th was declared the World Day of the Sick by St. John Paul II and was celebrated for the first time in Lourdes on February 11, 1993.

Our next special day is February 14th, on which the Church celebrates Sts. Cyril and Methodius, but most of us know this day as Valentine's Day. When researching his biography, there are various accounts of St. Valentine's life (and some note there was more than one Valentine). Most concur that he lived in Rome in the early 200's. One of the stories of Valentine states that he was martyred for refusing to renounce his Christian faith. Another variation of St. Valentine's life says he refused to sacrifice to pagan gods, was imprisoned and while imprisoned he healed the jailer's blind daughter. On the day of his execution, he left the girl a note signed, "Your Valentine." Regardless of which of the stories of Valentine is actually true, St. Valentine is known as a patron of young lovers and has exemplified love in his own life with dedicating his life to Christ as a priest and in dying a martyr for his Catholic faith. Let's not forget to visit Jesus in the Adoration Chapel on Valentine's Day and tell him we love him: "We love because He first loved us" (1 Jn 4:19).

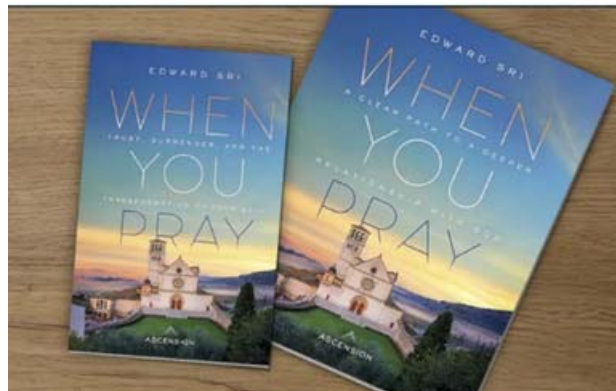

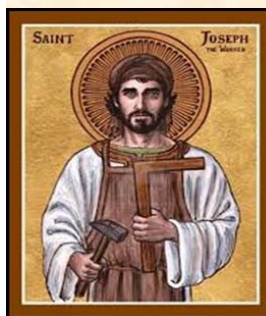

Cornerstone for Life

US rejoins pro-life coalition against 'right' to abortion days after Trump takes office

NEW YORK - A communication from the United States Mission to the United Nations has announced that the U.S. will rejoin the Geneva Consensus Declaration, a coalition of governments united around a pro-life policy stance.

Adopted in October 2020, the coalition is comprised of now 40 signatory countries that uphold the right to life of the unborn and affirm national sovereignty with regard to pro-life laws and policies.

The U.S. was a founding member of the Geneva Consensus Declaration. The Biden administration exited the coalition by executive order on January 28, 2021.

The Declaration affirms that "every human being has the inherent right to life" and declares that there is no international obligation to promote or fund abortion. It further emphasizes holistic strategies for advancing women's health and well-being, including maternal care, education, and economic development.

In addition, the Trump administration reinstated by executive order an expanded version of the Mexico City Policy, a mainstay of every Republican administration since 1984, which prohibits international non-governmental organizations that perform or promote abortion from receiving federal funding.

"By rejoining the Geneva Consensus Declaration and reinstating the expanded Mexico City Policy, the United States is committing to advancing a pro-life stance on the world stage, making clear that there is no so-called international 'human right' to abortion. This is a massive shift away from the virulent abortion promotion that characterized the Biden administration's international engagement, particularly in the developing world," commented Elyssa Koren, an international human rights lawyer for ADF International.

"The United States is saying no to the imposition of abortion pressure on sovereign nations. Rejoining the Geneva Consensus Declaration is sure to have a profound effect on governments that are trying to uphold their pro-life laws in the midst of extreme pressure from the pro-abortion lobby. Further, returning the U.S. to the coalition carries significant legal weight in that it prevents the emergence of a false 'human right' to abortion by customary international law.

"Life is a human right, and how American taxpayer dollars are deployed should reflect that truth. The expanded Mexico City Policy does just that," Koren further stated.
